DIRECTORY

COMPUTER

The time has come to purchase a computer system for the AHAA and to no longer "rent" time and space on the Iowa State computer system. Hopefully the purchase of a Macintosh system will be complete by summer. The AHAA will welcome any help with the final system selection and implementation and of course financial assistance is always welcome (total cost will be about \$3,000). SCHOLARSHIPS

For the fifth year, the AHAA will award a \$500 scholarship to an Ames High senior who "exemplifies the best in an all around student". This student is chosen from all

Ames High seniors by the high school scholarship committee. No application is necessary and the funds are drawn from the AHAA general funds.

For the second year, there will also be two additional \$500 scholarships that will be awarded to at least a second generation Ames High student. These students will be selected based on an application submitted to the high school scholarship committee. The funds are drawn from the alumni memorial fund and the number of scholarships awarded is determined by the amount of memorials received throughout the year. The AHAA encourages all Ames High seniors whose parents or grandparents are AHS alumni to apply for these scholarships.

AHS Today

Bond Issue Approved

On November 12, Ames voted on a \$10.7 million bond issue for the Ames community school district. It passed with 63 percent approval (60 percent approval was required). \$5.5 million is going to be used at the High School for numerous projects such as building new science labs and classrooms, as well as countless maintenance projects that have been postponed due to lack of funds.

"Our goal is to break ground on September 6, 1994," said Charles Achter, Ames High Principal. According to Achter, the High School project should be completed in a year and a half.

Knowledge Bowl Winners

For the fourth time in the competition's six-year history, Ames High won the area Heartland Knowledge Bowl. Three teams from AHS participated in the all-day competition, held in Johnston on November 23.

The day began with each team completing a written test. The results determined which two teams they would play against in the first oral round. After several of these rounds, the field was narrowed down to the final three. Ames; Team A, of Alex Schafroth, Jeffrey Willson, Phil McWaters, and Jesse Coats, beat teams from Boone and Pella-Christian. This qualifies the team for the national Knowledge Bowl, which will be held in Houston, Texas the first week of June.

Girl's Cross Country Title

No one on the Ames girls' cross-country team has ever won the individual state title before. But this year sophomore Ailienor Gilchrist did just that October 30 at the Iowa girls state cross-country meet in Fort Dodge.

"I wanted to get a top five finish," said Gilchrist. "I didn't think I would win, but there was always the possibility that I might. It feels weird to be the champ, but at the same time it is cool. Next year will be nerve racking because I will be the girl to beat, but I'm looking forward to it anyway."

Cheerleaders Win State

The AHS fall cheer squad won the state cheerleading competition November 6 at Southeast Polk High School. Ames defeated 28 other squads to retain the title for the third straight year. The Little Cyclone cheer squad outscored the other teams in the categories of motion technique, stunts, difficulty and sharpness.

As a result, the proposition of a Student Council was introduced before the entire student body, and it is needless to say that it met with very great approval.

The editor-in-chief of the Spirit, Donald Acheson, was chosen president of the Student Council. He is ably assisted by Ethel Davidson, vice-president; Daniel McLeod, secretary, and John Thurber, treasurer.

75 years ago (1919)...

The 1919 Track Season

Track was taken up very enthusiastically by the high school boys this season, considering that it had been in the background of unimportance in Ames High for three or four years and that all were inexperienced and in poor shape for the events.

Second Alumni Phonathon a GO!

The Ames Education Foundation will again sponsor a phonathon to raise funds for Ames High School. The funds this year will be used to purchase a video enlargement projector which will allow the students to use video technology with larger audiences such as at student assemblies, conference meetings, workshops and banquets. The sound system purchased last year in the phonathon project will be used with the video projector.

The goal of the phonathon is to raise \$5130 to cover the basic cost of the projector and to add a few accessories. Ames area alumni will be contacted by mail at the beginning of March with the phonathon to be held March 27. To limit postage and phone costs, only Ames area alumni will be contacted however all alumni are encouraged to support this project.

Art Gilkey's Remains Found After 40 Years

Ames High students of the early forties might be interested in the strange story of Art Gilkey. Art was a member of the class of 1944. However, during his junior year he entered Iowa State, taking advantage of an Iowa State wartime policy of admitting good students after their junior year.

During high school Art and two friends worked for wildlife specialist Dr. Paul Errington who was studying the eating habits of raptors such as hawks and owls which built their nests in the tall trees. The boys learned to climb trees which eventually led to an interest in climbing mountains. Their first big effort was climbing Devil's Tower. The boys continued their hobby.

At age 26, Art was invited to join a group of amateurs that wanted to climb Mount Godwin Austen, better known as K2 in what is now Pakistan. He accepted eagerly. The big effort was planned for July and August of 1953.

Things went well for the first part of the ascent but as they progressed they began to run into heavy snows which placed a burden on the heavily loaded climbers. Art had the misfortune of rupturing a vein in his leg which led to phlebitis, a totally disabling condition.

As they approached the summit at 25,500 feet, the weather worsened as did Art's

condition. The decision was made to turn back. On the descent, they discovered that an avalanche had destroyed their normal route. Art was left secured to two ice axes while the rest left to find an alternate route. When they came back, Art was not there.

Whether another avalanche took him to his death will never be known. To those of us who know this magnanimous youth well, we have not ruled out when he realized the problem he was creating, he may have resolved it in his own way.

Last summer, a few days before the 40th anniversary of his death, a British party found Art's remains. Art's brother Herb sent the following message: "Recently I learned that a British party on K2 discovered his remains in August on the Godwin-Austen Glacier near what has become the base camp area. The remains, the bones plus a few clothing scraps were found at a location consistent with the glacial movement since 1953. The clothing scraps are of material and style used on K2 only by that party. These and other factors make identity certain. The discovery was made, almost to the day, forty years after the accident."

Alumni Spotlight

Michelle Kelso Working For Human Rights

This past year has been quite exciting for me as I undertook many projects locally and abroad. Last spring I interned at the United Nations Centre for Human Rights where I gained insight to geopolitical affairs first hand. I witnessed the meeting of various UN bodies and participated in informal discussions covering the gamut of human rights.

Work at the Centre focused mainly on indigenous, women and children's rights. I began volunteering for a non-profit group called Coalition for Children of the Earth. The group promotes the Rights of the Child Convention via educational conferences and seminars.

As a conference coordinator and facilitator at their parallel children's conference to the UN World Conference on Human Rights, held in Austria last June, I worked with 200 children from 46 countries. Wanting Ames High students to share in this unique experience, I invited Leah Ulenhopp and Judd Horras to participate. They both joined me in Vienna.

All of the participants impressed me with their determination and drive to collectively collaborate to solve many of the crises facing children today. Two of the children addressed the UN plenary, calling for an end to suffering of young people. This was an historic moment in the child's rights movement as the UN delegates bowed

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their heads in respect for Rosa Anna Perla, an El Salvadorian girl whose father was slaughtered for his human rights work. In her impassioned speech, she requested a moment of silence for all the children suffering around the globe.

After Vienna, I traveled to Romania to work at a state-run institution for disabled children and adults. I stayed in Transylvania with Sister Mary Rose Christy, a Sister of Mercy nun and co-director of Touch Romania, a San Francisco based non-profit organization that administers at the orphanage. During the day I accompanied Sister at the institution. I played with the children, helped construct a playground,

and spoke with doctors about the problems at Riu Valdulei.

At first the living conditions shocked and depressed me, but as I acclimated to the scene, I saw beyond the exterior decay. With only one caretaker per ten residents, the hospital functions well for its minimalist budget thanks to Touch Romania's efforts. Whereas before gross shortages of food, clothing and supplies spurred maltreatment of residents, today the 278 persons who call it home have adequate clothes, meals, and care. But much more work needs to be done to insure that residents receive the occupational therapist, a dental clinic, and schools that they deserve to improve their living conditions.

The compilations of my experiences fuels my aspirations to develop multicultural studies programs, teach, and continue advocating for human rights. I will pursue graduate studies in anthropology and law.

As a privileged nation, we Americans must strive to eradicate our ignorance by educating ourselves about the customs and social practices of others. The eruption of ethnic conflicts across the world reaffirms the need to cultivate in harmony solutions to problems menacing many nations today.

Alumni Still Aiming High

Rosalee (Points) Oakley '55 has been elected President of the Association for Gravestone Studies, a national organization for the preservation of cemeteries and gravestones across the country. She heads a 25-member board of trustees that oversees the work of the 1,000 member organization.

Bernice (Black) Durand '59 has created and funded a research scholarship at Iowa State University. The goals of the fund are to provide a research component to add to an undergraduate student's educational experience, and to foster a close working relationship between the student and a professor. She is currently a physics professor at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and was recently honored as a recipient of the 1993 Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Teaching from the University of Wisconsin.

Steven Jenison '71 was one of two University of New Mexico doctors credited with developing a test to detect whether patients are infected with the hantavirus, which killed 23 people in the southwest United States last year. The disease has a fatality rate of 50 percent and is spread by the deer mouse.

Dwijavanti Athreya '93, Crystal Houge '93 and Melissa Mundt '93 were selected to the 1993-94 President's Leadership Class at Iowa State University. The class meets weekly at President Jischke's residence.
