Directory a Success

The first Ames High Alumni directory spearheaded by Jack Smalling '58 has already sold over 1180 copies since publication in July!

All 18,600 graduates dating back to 1878 are in the directory and are listed in alphabetical order, in order of their graduation and in geographical order.

Even deceased graduates are listed with the date and location of their death listed for nearly two-thirds of those people.

The section listing the graduates by class also contains some interesting information. The class of 1878 had four graduates, but there were no graduates in the class of 1879. In 1892, Alice Stuckslager is listed

as the only AHS graduate.

The directory also contains a section listing faculty members from 1920 to 1980.

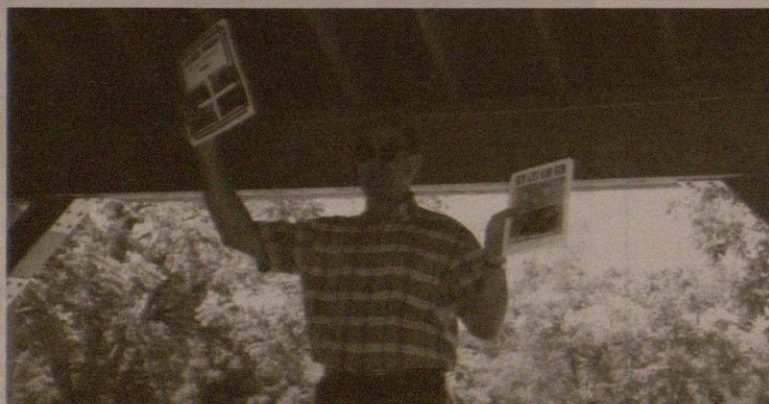
The alumni association was started in 1989. In 1990 the alumni association started printing newsletters and getting more information on graduates.

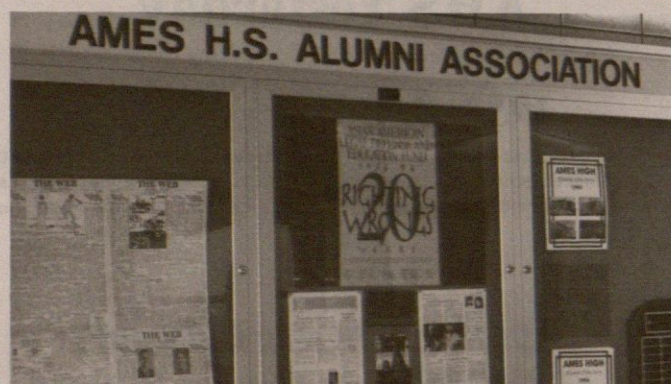

7 Selected to Hall of Fame

Seven new members have been selected to the Ames High School Athletic Department Hall of Fame. One former coach and six athletes will be honored at the banquet and induction ceremonies on Thursday, October 27.

Selected by the Hall of Fame jury were George Duvall '46, coach, Hilary "Babe" Ryan '36, Rollie Knight '46, Stan De La Hunt '47, Greg Foell '75, Laura Jennings '79, and Joe Gibbons '81. They comprise the third group to be named to the hall of fame.

For the third consecutive year, athletes who gained All-State and All-American recognition as well as a former NCAA champion are included among those to be inducted.

Counting the newly elected members, the hall of fame now numbers five former coaches and 34 athletes.

Four Retire at AHS

Four members of the AHS faculty retired this year.

John Hilgersen, a World Studies 9 teacher, completed his 34th year of teaching in Ames of 41 years overall. He does not know what he'll be doing next year, but he is considering a job change or some form of public service.

Hilgersen said he will miss the "academic challenge of preparing for a world studies course." He will also miss "challenging students to live in an interdependent world."

Richard Schneider will miss the teaching and the classroom. He considers a lot of the duties of teaching, such as faculty meetings, "completely unmissable," however. Schneider is also uncertain about his future plans.

Schneider has been teaching at AHS for 24 years in addition to two years before he came to AHS.

Gene Ulvestad is retiring from teaching, but he is not retiring for good. "I've been teaching for 35 years, and I thought I'd like to try something else before I get too old," Ulvestad said. "In order to do that, I have to retire. I'll miss all the students and the people I teach with," he said. "It's a wonderful place."

Mary Van Marel will also miss the teachers and the students at Ames High.

"It's a very nice place to work, and very friendly place. I will really miss the people," Van Marel said. Van Marel teaches ESL, career exploration, and Chapter 1.

In addition to teachers, four members of the support staff are retiring. They are custodian Ray Huston, Marilyn Larson and Charlene Wee from food service, and Harold Rittgers, who works in maintenance.

Ames High Still Aiming High

Dan Bond '85

As a student in the Ames schools, Dan Bond always seemed to be getting in trouble for doodling while teachers lectured.

It wasn't that he wasn't listening to the teachers. His drawings were so good they distracted other students.

Now millions of people are watching Bond's talents come to life on the big screen. He worked on the animation crew for the smash-hit Disney movie, "The Lion King."

Bond's role on the animation team was to make sure the main lion in the film, Simba, whose voice is done by Matthew Broderick, was drawn consistently.

Bond, who lives in Austin, Texas, spent eight months making sure Simba - who aged during the movie - looked good during his adult years.

After AHS Bond attended Iowa State University for a year and then transferred to the California Institute for the Arts where he graduated with a degree in animation in 1988.

Jeffrey McRoberts '72

Jeffrey McRoberts received a BA in theatre production and telecommunications from Iowa State University. In 1977 he moved to New York City to pursue a career as a performer which eventually led to lighting design.

Since then he has worked nationally and internationally in over two dozen countries on all five continents with companies like the Merce Cunningham Dance Company, Twyla Tharp, American Indian Dance Theatre, and many others.

His lighting has been seen at a variety of theatres and festivals worldwide including the Kennedy Center.

Nupur Ghoshal '91

Nupur Ghoshal, still just 20, is a genetics major at ISU who has been tagged by more than one professor as a once-in-a-lifetime student.

This is a woman who:

- * was mesmerized by the King Tut exhibit - at age 3;
- * was captivated by genetics in third grade after completing an in-depth profile of Charles Darwin;
- * as an ISU freshman, camped out overnight to ensure herself a spot in a graduate genetics course;
- * has taken 12 years of ballet, and 10 years of piano, studied French for five years, speaks two Indian languages and a dialect, and is a member of the ISU Singers;
- * will be a genetics major, a zoology minor and complete study as an ISU biotechnology scholar - and plans to do it in four years.
- * plans to pursue a point PhD-MD curriculum.

Goshal and her campus mentors credit her parents for instilling a great deal of this poise. In her application for the prestigious Barry M. Goldwater Scholarship she won last year, Goshal wrote, "Being the daughter of east-Indian immigrants, I understand and embrace the values of hard work and making your own mark in the world."

Jane Sassaman '71

Jane A. Sassaman was recently profiled in the *Chicago Sun-Times*. Jane's a prizewinning studio art quilter and designer. Sometimes she calls quilts "soft paintings" or "fabric constructions."

She just won second place at the American Quilter's Society Annual show in Paducah, KY.

She was in a London exhibit last year. She has been featured artist at the Thompson Center and visiting artist at the Art Institute's junior museum.

Jane's been quilting since 1980. She started because she was a textile and jewelry major.

Jane has a B.A. from Iowa State University. She met husband Gregory Gartner, a filmmaker and sculptor, at school. They live in West Lake View, Illinois, with two children.

Ben Saturen '66

Ben Saturen's one-story tribute to Pacific ocean tidepool life was completed in July 1993. The mural's coastal view design was inspired by photographs Saturen took while tidepooling in northern California.

The artist supervised a Petaluma High School student and faculty crew during the spring in a hands-on mural class.

A second, smaller mural portraying terrestrial birds and mammals was also completed. The two outdoor murals are located in the Mary Moreda Friendship Plaza at the Petaluma Wildlife and Natural Science Museum.

Thomas R. Hotchkiss '69

Thomas R. Hotchkiss who became a tireless advocate for AIDS education in mid-Iowa after he was diagnosed with the disease, died on May 26 at his home in Ames. He was 41.

"He could be really sick. But if he was asked to talk to somebody (a group), he would forget that he wasn't feeling well," said his mother, Dorothy Hotchkiss. "He loved being on stage."

Born in West Palm Beach, FL, the son of Donald and Dorothy Hotchkiss, he received his bachelor's and master's degree from ISU. He lived in Dallas before returning to Ames in 1991 after he became ill. He learned shortly thereafter that he had AIDS.

Hotchkiss, whose stage name was Toby Richard, thrust himself into the spotlight as a spokesman about AIDS. He clearly enjoyed his work, whether it was acting in area plays or visiting local high schools.

It's exciting to be an authority. I'm just sorry it's on this," he said in August 1993.

He told kids that a gift of cookies showed more affection than sex, that condoms are better than nothing, and that abstinence is the best bet of all. He also was a frequent contributor to *The Daily Tribune's* commentary page.

Katherine Abraham is the new commissioner of the Bureau of Labor Statistics which collects and releases the data that move financial markets and tell the country where its economy has been and, perhaps, where it is heading.

She is a graduate of Iowa State University, holds a Ph.D. from Harvard on labor economics and is a practitioner of what has been called the dismal science.

"I'm not especially interesting," she protests. "I do data."

One of her overriding ambitions at the Bureau of Labor Statistics is to remain uninteresting. "If all is going well, it's not a particularly high-profile job. And that's the way I like it," she said.

Her job is to preserve the integrity of the 22 official statistical reports kept by the bureau, including unemployment and inflation, both of which are compiled in a locked area by a tightly controlled group of employees.
