Everett Ritland dies at 89



Everett Ritland died June 11, 1999 at the age of 89 due to complications of Alzheimer's disease. He graduated from Huxley High School in 1928 and Luther College in 1932. He received a master's degree from Iowa State University in 1941. He was a teacher, coach, athletic director, guidance counselor and Associate Principal at Ames High School, serving a total of 39 years. He retired from work in 1975. Following his retirement, he spent 21 years as a part-time substitute teacher.

While Mr. Ritland devoted his life to teaching and education, he had a simple philosophy about what should always be taught in schools to ensure children are well prepared for life. "When I was in school, I spent at least two hours a day in the gym or playing ball," he said. "Latin taught me literacy and communication and sports taught me how to get along with people. That's what you need to know."

Mr. Ritland is survived by his wife Betty and his children Michael '53, Rosemary '55, Patricia '59 and Mark '65.

Mendenhall Remembered



The winningest wrestling coach in Ames High history found one competitor even he couldn't beat. Cancer claimed Jack Mendenhall on May 24, 1999 at the age of 62.

Mendenhall coached the Little
Cyclones for 29 years until he retired
from wrestling in 1994 with a 223-183
record in dual meets. In 1981, he was
named 3A Coach of the Year.
Mendenhall also taught physical
education and served 21 years as a
Little Cyclone assistant football and
track coach.

"He had all the fine, outstanding qualities a coach should have - integrity, honesty and he was hard working," said Keith Bailey, Mendenhall's best friend and former wrestling assistant. "He took good kids and made them state champs, and he took a few lesser kids and made them state champs, too."

In all, Mendenhall coached 20 state champions, including Jim and Joe Gibbons, who went on to win NCAA national titles at Iowa State. Mendenhall also turned out athletes who followed his career path. As many as 10 of his former wrestlers went on to coach at the high school or collegiate level.

Those who coached with and against Mendenhall said he was a great coach. Those who knew him best called him an even better man.

"I feel fortunate to have walked alongside him," said Bud Legg. "There are many friends of his who knew him in many walks of life. Everyone has their own Jack Mendenhall story."

Mendenhall is survived by his wife Connie, and his children Sharie '77, Linda '79 and Patti '81.

Ben Godar '96 is the Arts and Entertainment editor of the Daily, the lowa State University newspaper. He is a junior in sociology at ISU. Kristina Hawbaker '96 recently was elected president of the Circle K Club at Iowa State University. Circle K is a division of Kiwanis International which is dedicated to service in communities worldwide. Kristina is a senior at ISU, majoring in English education.

Bryan Warme '96 participated this summer in a 63 day bike trip from Conn. to Vancouver which was organized by Yale University students as a fund raiser for Habitat for Humanity. The trip was about 4,200 miles in all, passing through 10 states and two Canadian provinces. The thirty riders collected more than \$200,000 in donations. Most important, though, Warme learned a little something about humanity. "People really opened their arms to us," he said. "I have a lot of confidence in people and their generosity now."

Building links between Iowa, Yucatan

In fifth grade, Paulie (Gibbs)
Williams '46 wanted to be a missionary - a missionary in China.

She grew up and became a volunteer and activist within the borders of Story County instead, but she never lost her desire to introduce cultures to each other and to be an ambassador.

And now, as a 70-year-old greatgrandmother, Williams is doing just that.

The Ames resident spends three months a year in the Yucatan - northern Mexican state that juts out into the Gulf of Mexico - doing good deeds and cultivating international friendships. Since 1987, Williams and her husband, Bob, have gone there every winter. And she's played host to many Yucatecans in her Ames home that she has to guess at the number (40? 50?).

"People say she's been just the

greatest ambassador for lowa and the Yucatan," said Sarah Lande, executive director of lowa Sister States, a nonprofit group that links lowa with eight international states. "She's one of those tireless workers. When she gets an idea in mind and decides to go for it, it happens."

For that reason, Williams was named the Iowa Sister States' volun-

teer of the year.

The award was gratifying said Williams. But it's the work that she really likes.

"I wanted to be a missionary...and that never happened in my life," she said. "So it's an opportunity to be in mission."



Ames High's Luke Guthrie didn't feel he was doing anything extraordinary when he helped a competitor finish a race at the boys' state track meet at Drake Stadium. The Iowa High School Athletic Association thought otherwise and presented Guthrie with a National Award of Excellence certificate.

Guthrie was running near the middle of the pack in the 1,600-meter run when a Marshalltown runner tripped and injured his hip with nearly 600 meters left in the race. Guthrie dropped back and encouraged the runner to get up and finish the race.

"Actually, I really didn't think I did anything that special," Guthrie said. "I really didn't think about doing it, I just did it, but the award is really neat."

DECA State Secretary from Ames

Justin Cochren was elected secretary of the Iowa DECA group representing 40-plus Iowa high schools. As secretary, he will attend all meetings and compile minutes of discussion sessions. He also will be called on to give presentations and write the Iowa group's newsletter.

And Cochren's election to the state group's governing body continues a tradition at Ames High School - at least one Ames student has been elected to the state board in all but one of Darrill Abel's 32 years as the local coordinator.

AHS in Seventeen

Seventeen magazine profiled Ames High School in their "School Zone" section, a regular fashion series that features schools nationwide with innovative programs. This is the first time lowa was represented in School Zone, now in its sixth year. Seventeen staff members looked at schools in lowa cities and decided that Ames was the most interesting - primarily because of its programs and collegetown location. 45 to 50 students wearing interesting outfits were interviewed and photographed over a three day period before and after school.

Dear Tom,

Since you're often in our home, please excuse the familiarity of using "Tom". Furthermore, we are your seniors.
