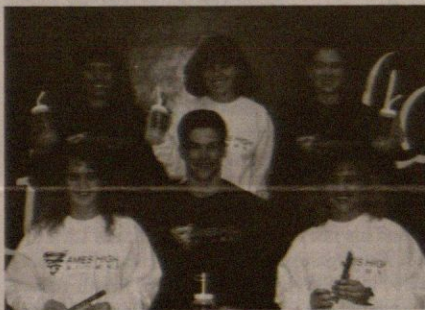

Ames High School Alums Join

Annual Ames High Seniors Show March 3 through April 14, 1991

John Buck '64, now a nationally known artist, will be one of the artists featured in the Ames High School Alums exhibition, at the Octagon in Ames.

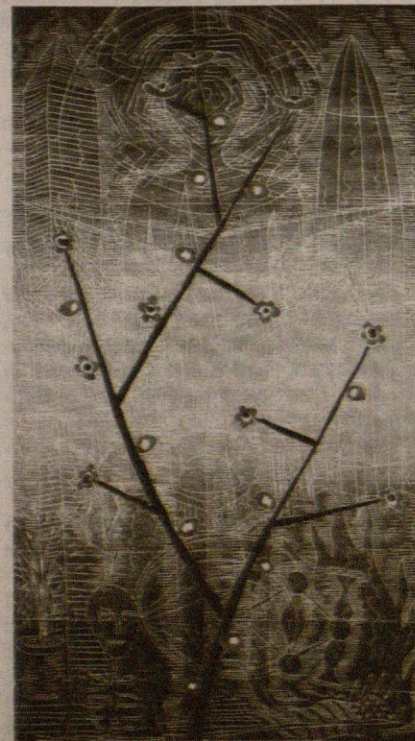
An appropriate part of the Octagon's 25th Anniversary, the special exhibit will show the work of graduates who are now making their living in the arts. Many of the artists were participants in the Octagon's annual Ames High School Senior show in the past and were award winners in our regional Scholastic Art Awards exhibit. They have kept in touch with many of the artists and have followed their careers.

Now living in all parts of the country the artists have responded enthusiastically. Some are also interested in participating in workshops that are being arranged at Ames High School. Five artists will be selected to spend one day each at Ames High during the week following the opening of the exhibit.

The Octagon has received a grant from the Iowa Arts Council to help fund the exhibition. Additional contributions are being received from Ames High School and the community to help match the grant. A commemorative catalogue will be produced.

The annual Ames High School Seniors Show will be held at the same time, displayed in our new "Friends Gallery", the balcony area of the auditorium refurbished in part by a contribution from the Friends of the Octagon. Between 40 and 50 artists will be represented by five pieces each. The traditional awards will be presented, made possible by two memorial funds in the Octagon Endowment Fund - the David Burton Stone Fund and the Jeffrey L. Brown Photography Award Fund - and the First National Bank.

A reception honoring the artist will be held on Sunday, March 3, from 2 to 5 p.m., with entertainment provided by Ames High School music groups.

Alumni Spotlight

Dick Paulson, World Traveler and Diplomat

Richard Paulson '29 recently called Mary Jackson, AHAA president and offered to share some anecdotes about his relationship with the Royal Family of England. After enjoying Paulson's letter, Jackson decided to add some of his other accomplishments to this Alumni Spotlight.

First, the letter's relevant points. Richard E. Paulson, O.B.E. (Order of the British Empire presented by King George VI at Buckingham Palace July 1946) was a U.S. representative at the Field Marshall William Slim Memorial installation in Whitehall (adjacent to Sir Walter Raleigh's statue, near 10 Downing Street, London,) April 28, 1990. The Field Marshall commanded the British China, Burma and India campaign of World War II to which some Americans including Paulson were attached.

Her Royal Highness the Queen, Prince Charles and the Duke of Edinburgh represented the Royal Family and Countess Mountbatten of Burma represented her late father, Admiral Mountbatten, the Allied S.E. Asia commander.

Paulson adds the "For the third time, Prince Charles and I exchanged pleasantries. The second time I met him, he recalled my name and our first conversation. What a memory! (The Prince) had played polo the day I met him and, since I had played years ago myself, I asked if he had sore knees. He laughed and said he did. Fairly recently he broke his arm playing. I find him intelligent, witty and very easy to talk to."

Continuing, Paulson states, "I'd had tea with

Queen Elizabeth in Buckingham Palace after the El Alemein reunion in 1976, and she had made me an honorary member of Her Household Cavalry and Guard's Club. That's where my wife (the former Mary McNally of AHS teacher fame) and I stay when we are in London."

"I've just met Countess Mountbatten, but I knew her late parents, Lord and Lady Mountbatten. We exchanged Christmas cards until they passed beyond the rainbow. I was with Admiral Mountbatten when he entered Singapore for the first time after World War II," adds Paulson.

Richard Paulson was described in his Ames High yearbook as "rapid, radical, passionate and particular." He was involved in "A" Club for three years and served as president his senior year. He also was active in Hi-Y three years serving on its cabinet two years. Something of a jock, he played basketball and football as well as participating in track. He was also in the senior class play.

Since graduating in 1929, Paulson has earned an L.L.B. Juris Doctor degree from the University of Georgia 1935 and received a cavalry commission in the last year they were presented. He completed geographic studies at the University of Munich in Germany in 1938.

From 1941 to 1946 he served in World War II and his last commission was that of Lt. Colonel. During this time he trained with the American Field Service in Capetown, South Africa, was attached to the Free French Forces in Damascus, Beirut, Baalbek and Jerusalem, was attached to the British 8th Army Sahara Desert Campaign -- El Alemein, Egypt to Tripoli, Libya -- under Field Marshall Montgomery against Field Marshall Rommel, and served in the China-

Burma-India Theatre described previously in this article. He flew from Calcutta, India to Chengdu, China over Tibet and the Himalayan hump to try to obtain supplies for General Chenault and his Flying Tigers and was attached to Mountbatten's staff as mentioned before.

From 1946 to 1976 Paulson worked the U.S. State Department Foreign Service serving the American Consulate General in Shanghai, American embassies in Rangoon, Burma; Djakarta, Indonesia; Bangkok, Thailand; Beirut, Lebanon; New Delhi, India; and Kabul, Afghanistan. He also had a three month special assignment in Moscow, Russia. He retired in 1976.

From 1965 to the present, he has had some other interesting opportunities including in 1971, assisting in setting up President Nixon's Mission to China. He accompanied the President on that trip. In 1972 he was one of those who briefed Henry Kissinger on China when he was Secretary of State and went with Kissinger to Beijing that year.

In early 1988, Paulson made his 32nd trip to Beijing since 1965 to consult for the U.S. State Department with two Vice Premiers he has known for 45 years. In 1986 he was one of 12 Americans invited to the 40th Burma Reunion at Royal Albert Hall in London.

His honors abound, and one thing is certain, few alumni have travelled as extensively and as importantly for their country. Alumni association president Jackson met Paulson as a customer in her jewelry store years ago and commented, "It's always a delight to see Dick because you can ask him about any aspect of world events and he can give you from first hand experience

Oceanic Wildlife Painter Ben Saturen '66

Ben Saturen's '66, fine art/educational poster portraying 32 marine mammals, ocean birds, fish, invertebrates and plants native to the waters surrounding North America was featured on the cover of the September 1990 issue of *California Diving News*.

For artist/scuba diver Ben Saturen, portraying the world's undersea environment has been a full-time occupation since 1980.

Although he admits he has a strong attraction for diving in warm, tropical waters, he makes his home in Northern California. Many of his artistic images reflect the kelp forest beauty. "I'll never forget the first time I plunged beneath the ocean surface and discovered a remarkable aquatic forest filled with translucent nudibranchs, orange bat stars, giant green anemones, iridescent abalone and playful sea lions," says the artist.

Because of his knowledge of undersea diver-

sity, Nature Discovery Press commissioned him in 1989 to create a painting of 32 North American marine wildlife species. This year, the painting was reproduced as a fine art/educational poster and is currently available at Nature Company Stores.

The poster's potential to educate a large national audience on the complexity - and beauty - of the undersea is exciting to Saturen. Getting the art-buying public to accept undersea wildlife, particularly the marine invertebrates, has been a challenge.

"I like to think of myself as following in the tradition of Millet. He pointed out that the chief mission of an artist is to reveal that portion of nature's riches which he has discovered to those who would not otherwise have suspected their presence," Saturen said.

Saturen's artistic accomplishments are many. He is a member of the prestigious Society of Animal Artists, and is listed in the Who's Who in American Art. Saturen has been featured in *California Diving News*, *The Artist's Magazine* and *Wildlife Art News*.

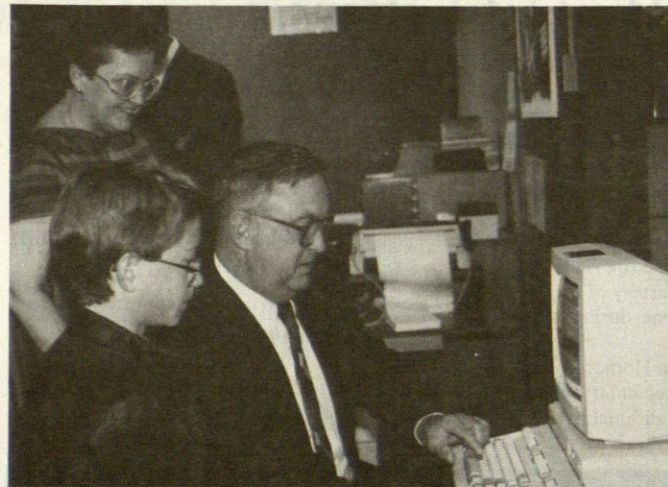

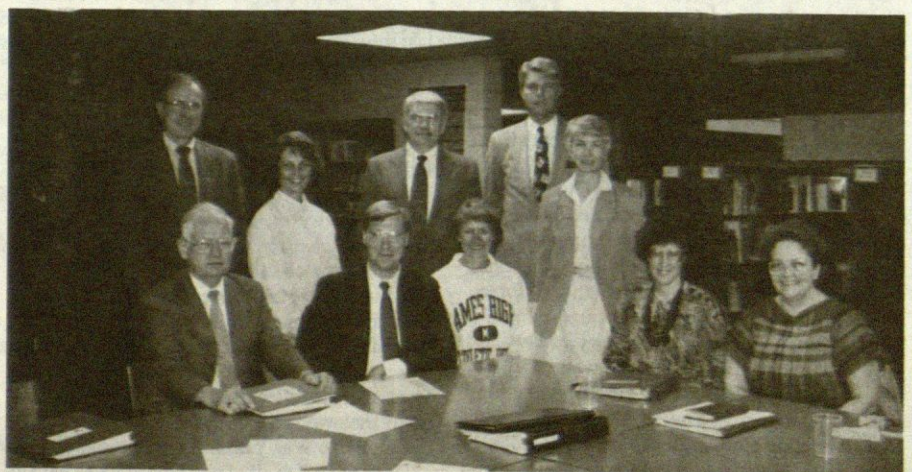

Transition Period Recalled

I have been commissioned by the powers that be to write an article concerning the transition period in the year 1938-39 when we built the new high school at 5th & Clark. So far I don't know exactly what my commission is and I haven't found out who the "powers that be" are either!

It so happens that I started teaching in Ames High in the fall of 1938. I came in the very year of the transition. Simply put, this was the situation: the old Central School located at 5th & Clark was torn down. So the question was, what are you going to do with both the junior and senior high students?

The answer was high school students attended school from 7 a.m. until noon and junior high students went to school from noon until 5 p.m. all in what was first the old high school building. Junior high students had their physical education class in the morning with the high school students in the afternoon both at the old Field House on Lincoln Way.

It was not the best of situations but you can do anything if you have to since there was no better alternative. Herb Adams and Verna Schmidt were the two principals and they agreed to agree — and that wasn't easy! Let me hasten to add that both were very fine people and highly respected. They got along fine with only a few minor skirmishes!


The new high school was completed and we all moved in the fall of 1939. Central Junior High became the sole proprietors of what originally was the high school building. They then moved

into the high school building when the schools up at 20th Street and Ridgewood were built. They were completed in phases beginning with the 1960-61 school year.

The 1913-39 high school building was torn down and the block is now occupied by the First National Bank and a parking lot for the new location of Ames City Hall. Central Junior High and Ames High School students can be very proud of the complete renovation of their old school. It is a beautiful city hall facility.

Where are the Central students now? A new Welch Junior High School was built at 321 State Street. The old Welch building was torn down. All ninth grade students are now part of Ames High School. Welch Junior High was renamed Ames Middle School. All seventh and eighth grade students attend Ames Middle School. Welch and Central Junior High Schools no longer exist.

Did you know that the old Field House was originally a Chataqua building. The frame was bought by the schoolboard and moved to the Lincoln Way site where it became a brick athletic and physical education facility, dressing rooms and all. It was moved from the Chataqua location east of the cemetery on 13th Street. More about ...

Bell, Jug

From the first football game ever played between Ames and Boone in 1906 (won by Ames 16 to 0) until the last one in the long series in 1972 (won by Ames 37 to 8) there was an intense rivalry.

Games were not played annually until 1918. Sometime in the late twenties a beautiful green urn was purchased to serve as a token of victory. It became known as the "green jug".

The 1933 game was won by Boone. They were not to win a game again until 1962 although there were two ties—one in 1937 and the other in 1948.

Because the winner's name and the score were posted each year on the jug it became increasingly embarrassing to Boone people for the disparity in success. The intensity of the rivalry increased.

It manifested itself at first in daubing paint and graffiti on an overpass between the cities and finally on each other's buildings.

In an attempt to improve relations between the two schools each made overtures of friendship. For instance, in the mid-fifties Ames invited the Boone basketball fans to a post-game party.

That night the jug, reposing at the top of the stair opposite the library, disappeared. It was, of course, assumed that Boone students were guilty of a prank.

Some years later when the writer had become friendly with a Boone alum he asked if he knew what had happened to the green jug. He admitted that a group of Boone boys had taken it to a rustic retreat in a heavily wooded area high above the Des Moines River and broken it to bits.

In a confrontation with the Boone principal, Pete Solar, he accepted responsibility and indicated he would furnish a replacement.


In the meantime, Boone which had been an important railway terminal, lost some of its importance with the decline in the use of railways. In the old roundhouse were a number of railway relics of bygone days including a bell.

This bell was placed on a heavy wooden base and offered as a replacement for the jug. This was acceptable to Ames.

With the decline in the importance of railways, Boone suffered a decline in population and a commensurate loss of prestige. This reflected on their sports success.

However before the end came and the end of the original Central Iowa Conference, Boone had several powerful teams that dominated Ames. With the demise of Ames from the CIC the intensity of the rivalry diminished.

This must be so because the bell remains in Boone in spite of the fact that Ames won the last game of the series 37 to 8 in 1972.

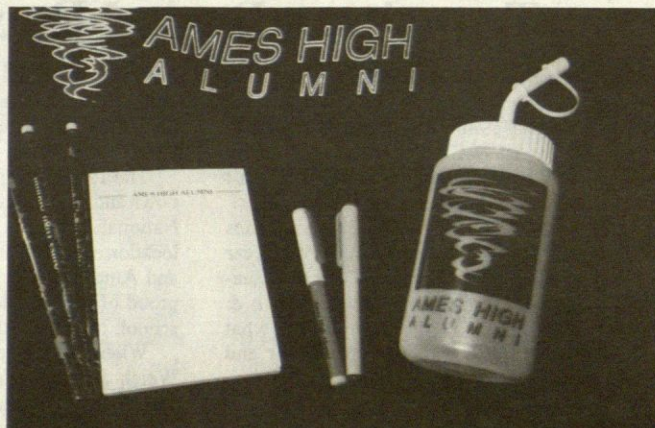
